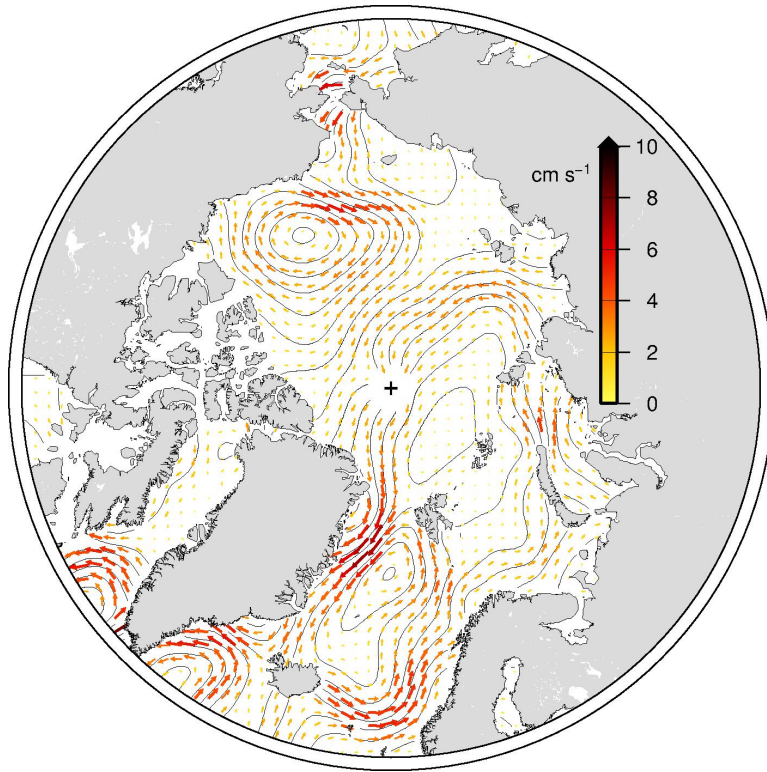


Figure S1: The 2011-2014 Arctic mean geostrophic currents and the associated DOT (contours drawn at 5cm intervals. The additional noise above $\sim 84^\circ\text{N}$ is noise in the GOCO03s geoid model owing to the orbital inclination of GOCE (96.7°).

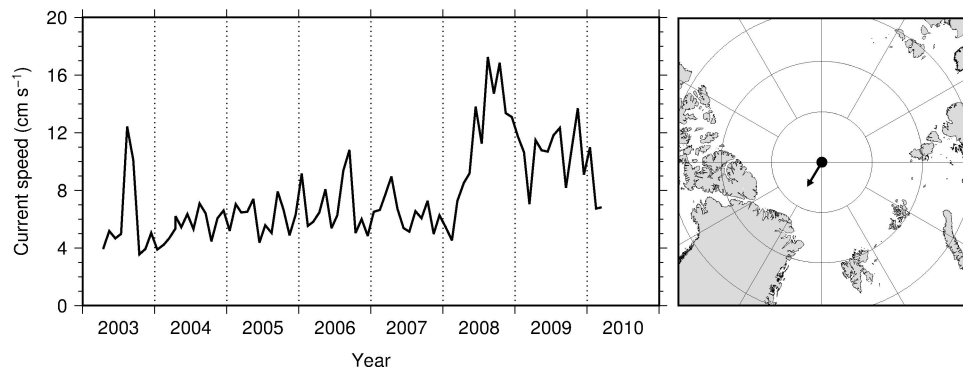

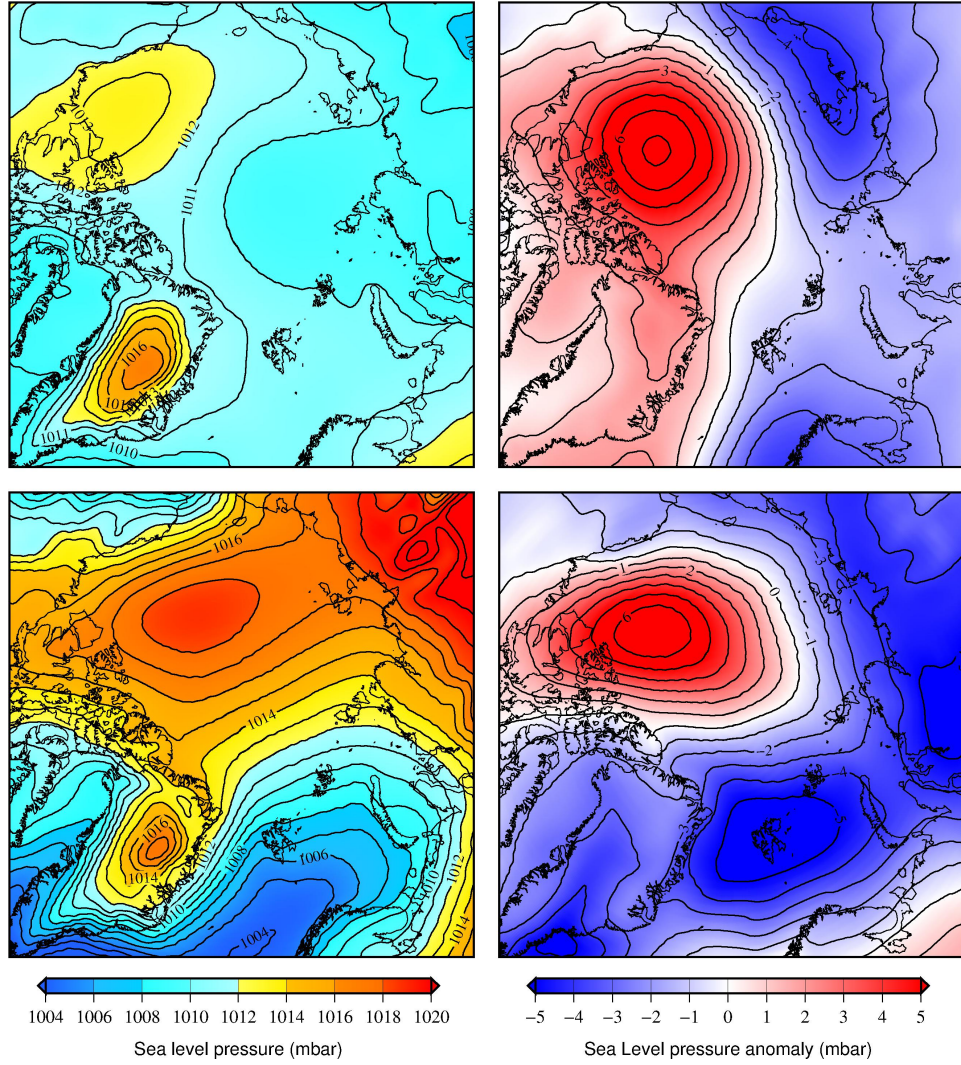
